- The recent NMBCA re-authorization legislation lowered the mandatory cost-sharing requirement from 3-to-1 to 2-to-1 meaning with \$200,000 of matching contributions you can request \$100,000 in grant funds.
- NMBCA is keenly interested in supporting the priority conservation interventions identified in Conservation Investment Strategies, such as the three shorebird flyway CISOs (PASCA, MCSI, AFSI).
- The US Agency for International Development (USAID) directs some funds to USFWS to support shorebird projects in two major shorebird flyways (Atlantic and Pacific) and there will likely be a call for proposals in January 2025 and perhaps \$1.5-2M available. It is as of yet unclear whether the Midcontinent Shorebird flyway can be integrated into this opportunity, but at earliest it would be in 2026.
